Definition

Mistreatment covers instances of racism, sexism, gender discrimination, as well as any other form of discrimination or verbal abuse. One may feel insulted or threatened based on their identity (e.g., sex, race, national origin, sexual orientation, values, etc.)

Harassment includes any action(s) that may be considered unwanted or annoying from one party or a group. This can consist of threats, demands, and/or feeling uncomfortable with how someone treats you. This may be systematic or a one-time occurrence.

Physical and sexual assault are criminal acts while harassment generally violates civil laws.

Steps to Follow
