Definition

All faculty, staff and students must report observed or suspected research misconduct and other violations of research integrity to the Research Integrity Officer (RIO).

Research Misconduct includes fabrication, falsification, or plagiarism in proposing, performing, or reviewing research, or in reporting research results.

Other Violations include failure to disclose conflicts of interest (COI); breach of confidentiality; dishonesty in publication (misleading or misrepresenting research related facts or authorship); property violations (stealing, tampering with, or destroying physical and intellectual property of others); failure to report observed research misconduct; retaliation.

*Questionable Research Practices such as reports of careless, irregular, or contentious research practices, as well as authorship disputes, may not meet the standard for research misconduct but may be a research integrity violation.
